LONDON - The use of household cleaning sprays could be contributing to a rise in cases of asthma, a leading health expert has warned.

Chlorine, bleach, disinfectants and other cleaning agents can spark asthma and worsen existing symptoms. Jan-Paul Zock, from the Centre for Research in Environmental Epidemiology in

Barcelona, said.

While addressing a European allergy conference in London, he also warned that professional cleaners and health workers who use products in hospitals are particularly vulnerable.

Zock said that previous studies had already found higher rates of asthma among caretakers, cleaners, housekeepers and nurses.

Inhaling bleach, ammonia, decalcifiers, acids, solvents and stain removers more than once a week was linked to a 20 per cent rise in asthma or wheezing, the expert said.

People who frequently use cleaning products are most at risk, as are those who use them for long periods. The strength of a product, in addition to room ventilation, also affect the risk.

Zock said that more studies were needed to be done on people's exposure at home, which can be difficult to track.

However, he said, many people at home could be at risk.

"The number of people at risk is very large," the Scotsman quoted Zock as saying.

"We need to consider the ubiquitous use of cleaning products at home," he added. (ANI)



June 3rd, 2010 LONDON - Children who eat a [diet rich in](#) fruit, vegetables and fish have a lower risk of asthma and wheezing, scientists have found. However, eating three or more burgers a week can increase the risk.

Shampoos, detergents 'form harmful substance in wastewater'

May 27th, 2010 WASHINGTON - Certain ingredients in shampoo, detergents and other household cleaning agents may be a source of precursor materials for formation of a suspected cancer-causing contaminant in water supplies that receive water from sewage [treatment plants](#), claim scientists. [The study](#), published in ACS' Environmental Science and Technology, sheds new light on possible environmental sources of this poorly understood water contaminant, called NDMA.

Asthmatic kids at increased risk of developing COPD

May 17th, 2010 WASHINGTON - A new study from the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne has shown that children with severe asthma have more than 30 times the risk of developing adult [chronic obstructive lung disease](#) (COPD) as adults compared to children without asthma. "There is important epidemiological evidence to suggest that events in childhood that influence lung growth constitute a significant risk for COPD.

Exposure to violent crime may exacerbate asthma in kids

May 1st, 2010 WASHINGTON - Living in a high-crime neighborhood may worsen children's asthma, says a new study. The study has been presented at the Pediatric Academic Societies (PAS) annual meeting in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada.

Air pollution exposure at schools linked to development of asthma in kids

April 7th, 2010 WASHINGTON - A new study led by researchers at the Keck School of Medicine of the University of Southern California (USC) suggests that traffic-related pollution near schools is linked to the development of [asthma in kids](#). Study's lead author Rob [McConnell](#), professor of preventive medicine at the Keck School of Medicine of USC, and colleagues found that the risk of developing asthma due to exposure at school was comparable to that of children whose exposure occurred primarily at home, even though time spent at school only accounted for about one third of waking hours.

Low vitamin D levels associated with higher rates of asthma among kids

March 18th, 2010 WASHINGTON - African American children with asthma in metropolitan Washington, DC, are significantly more likely to have low levels of vitamin D than healthy African American children, researchers have claimed. The study by researchers at Children's National Medical Center has been published in The Journal of Pediatrics.

Socioeconomic stresses may mean early death

February 19th, 2010 WASHINGTON - Individuals who live in areas with lower household incomes are much more likely to die because of their personal and household characteristics and their community surroundings, says a Virginia Commonwealth University researcher. The study, which claims that socioeconomic status can affect life expectancy, was led by Steven H.

Herbal cure not good for asthma patients

February 4th, 2010 WASHINGTON - Asthma patients using herbal [remedies](#) may make their quality of life worse and suffer from increased frequency of symptoms, a new study claims. A study conducted by American College of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology observed 326 asthma patients over a 33-month period.

Vacuuming burns up more calories than a Wii workout

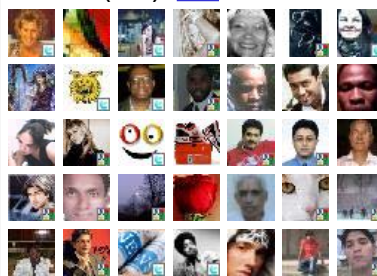

In the new research, experts found that most asthmatic patients suffer from hayfever-like symptoms known as allergic rhinitis, triggered by indoor allergens.

Vicks nasal sprays recalled over bacteria fears

November 20th, 2009 LONDON - Vicks nasal sprays have been recalled from markets in the United States, Germany and the United Kingdom, after it was learnt that they contained a dangerous bacteria. A routine testing procedure in Germany found the spray could contain the bacteria B.

Common plastic chemical 'contributes to ADHD in kids'

November 20th, 2009 WASHINGTON - A plastic chemical found in consumer products, such as toys, cleaning materials, plastics, and personal care items appears to contribute to attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) in kids, say researchers. Korean scientists have found a positive association between plastic chemical phthalates and behavioural and cognitive problems in children.
